


Volleyball Wrap up by Justice Clark




SPOOKY SCARY STORIES by Ashton Garagnani




More haunted houses close by are: Black Forest and Haunted Hayrides. Check them out for a scary fun time!




Third Grade Reading by Mrs. Hahs


My third grade class presented The Strongest One play from our reading book last week. The students did a great job!




