Youth Coding League is an introductory program to computer programming. It is targeted towards 5th through 8th grade students. It helps give students a head start on jobs such as app and software development.

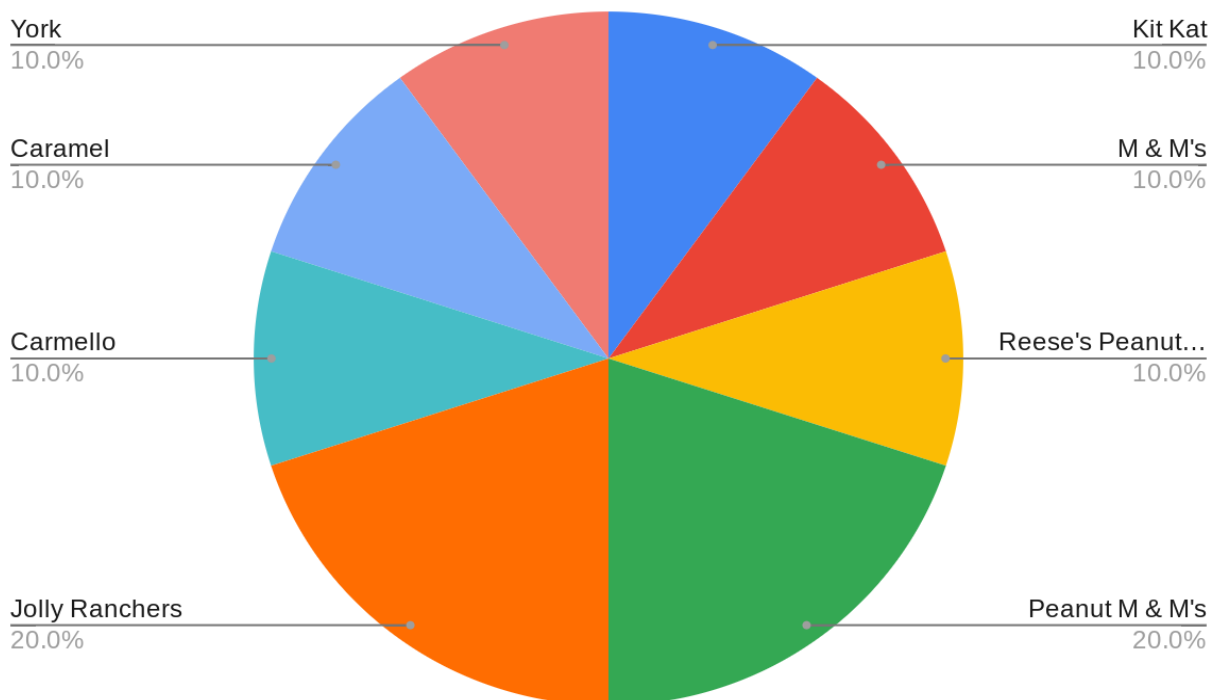
